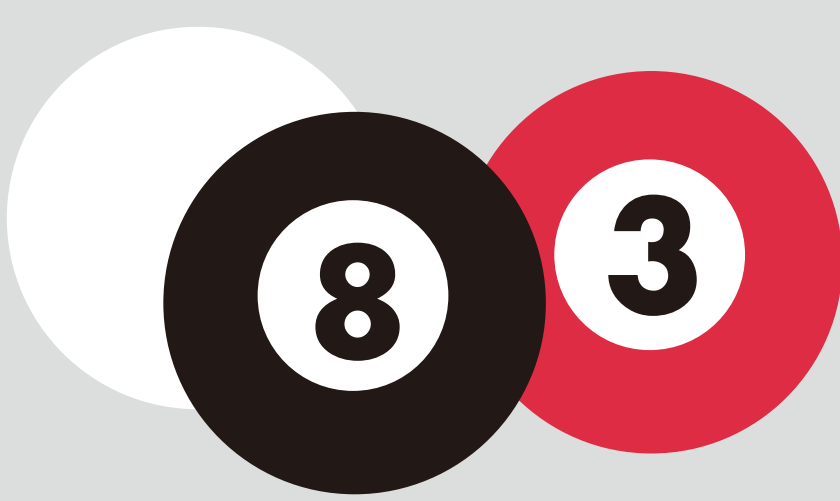


Billiard Table

Buying Guide



Owning a billiard table is a great entertainment investment. When it comes to the decision on purchasing a billiard table, it is important to consider the table size, style, construction and more to ensure you are making a wise decision based on your preference and budget.

Tip ! Make sure to measure the dimensions of the room beforehand. Also consider of the backswing distance during gameplay and any obstacles that could affect the game, such as furniture, built-ins, or partial walls.

6 Things to Look for When Choosing a Pool Table:



Bed / Playfield

- Slate is the professional grade bed material. It is considered the most durable surface with optimal roll, precise leveling and longevity but also the most expensive.
- Particle Board bed surface is suitable for home and recreational use at a more affordable price with decent ball roll and leveling.

Cloth

- Most of the fabric that covers a pool table is made from a blend of wool and synthetic fabrics such as polyester which provides the maximum durability and playability.
- Common felt colors on the traditional style table are green and red felt, provides a vintage look.



Cabinet

The frame provides the foundation support for the playing surface. The sturdier of the frame, the better overall durability.

- Common types of frame: Solid wood (quality finish, stronger and expensive) and MDF (mixed wood, denser and affordable).
- Common types of finishing: Paint finishing (high-end furniture models) and Lamination (mid-level models).

Rails

The top part of the table where cushions are attached to and the sights are inlayed.

- Common top rail materials: Solid wood and MDF depending on your preference and budget.
- Cushion response is an important fact for playing experience. K66 cushion is the standard type for American billiard table.

Leg Options / Styles

Legs of the billiard table support the overall weight of the table cabinet and provide great aesthetics for the entire table.

- Common leg options: Solid and hollow with inner support system and metal.
- Common leg styles: Traditional, modern and arcade. Most classic billiard table legs are the traditional style with claw design. The design of the legs will match according to the overall table style.



Accessories

Most of the billiard table comes with the essentials:

- 1-set of 8 ball in 2 ¼-inches
- 1 triangle rack
- 2 cue sticks
- 2 chalks
- 1 felt brush
